ECSA PRESIDENT ELECTED CHAIRPERSON OF THE FEDERATION OF ENGINEERING ORGANISATION BOARD COMMITTEE ON MEMBERSHIP

The Engineering Council of South Africa's (ECSA) President, Eng Refilwe Buthelezi, was elected FAEO Chairperson of Membership Committee following the Federation of African Engineering Organisations (FAEO) Board Meeting which took place in March 2022.

The election of Ms Buthelezi comes amid ECSA's strategic intent to actively participate in different local and international engineering organisation structures that it is a member country of. - Consider issues relating to discontinuation of membership in accordance with the procedures
- Consider any other issues relating to applications, renewals, or cancellation of membership of the Federation
- Ensure the privacy and confidentiality of all applications

The objective of FAEO is to develop and direct the relationship between its several member organisations based on mutual understanding, so that their activities may be fostered and directed to the greater public good and that it represents the engineering profession in Africa and internationally.
